





WORKPLACE SERVICES

Recorra provides a range of in-office recycling and circular economy services to help companies reduce their impact on the environment.

With us, customers can decrease their carbon impact, reduce the cost of their recycling and waste disposal, and boost their recycling rates.





Secure collection, data wiping, repair and reuse of any redundant IT and electricals.



We collect all types of furniture whether it's office chairs, desks or cabinets.



Secure and compliant shredding and recycling services.



A tabletop box for hard-to-recycle plastics and films (such as snack wrappers, coffee pods, and stationery).



Supplies and stationery made from the recycling we collect, delivered nationwide. Our ecargo bike delivers office supplies across London.



We collect and recycle textiles and clothing, the waste from this industry is the second largest polluter after oil.



RECYCLING SERVICES



RECYCING HUB

Our Recycling Hub was created to help occupiers/tenants recycle a wider range of materials within their buildings.

Recycling Hub users can select niche recycling services – such as paper towels, coffee grounds, coffee cups, and plastic kegs - which go beyond the standard services we provide to their building.

Once ordered, cleaning teams deposit the prepaid sacks into the dedicated bin in the building's bin store.

By separating different material streams, we can increase boost recycling rates and reduce waste contamination.























SERVICE INNOVATIONS



SMARTWEIGH

In 2023, Recorra launched its SmartWeigh service, an innovative app-based weighing solution to measure building occupier waste and recycling output, powered by Trackersack technology.

Shared waste stores can make it difficult to track how much waste each occupier generates, and to identify sources of contamination. This poses challenges to clients looking to achieve occupier or floor-level reporting, recharge occupiers on output, and/or improve recycling levels and quality.

Recorra SmartWeigh combines weighing technology with a smartphone app to track occupier waste generation. This provides a novel alternative to bespoke equipment and having to weigh sacks by hand.

Exclusive to Recorra clients is a Kiosk Mode (patent pending).

Beyond barcoding technology, Kiosk Mode allows for incremental weighing of sacks, meaning sacks of the same waste stream can be weighed in one swift movement. This reduces weighing time by up to 80%, reducing costs for users.


Accurate waste data provides insights into patterns, trends, and potential inefficiencies of the waste management process at any given site.



OPERATIONAL INNOVATIONS



ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE (AI) CAMERAS

Recognising the sorting process's pivotal role in maximising recyclable yield and revolutionising recycling practices, we prioritise efficiency, accuracy, and speed.

Our partnership with Artificial Intelligence (AI) organisation Greyparrot has introduced AI-driven robotic arms to our Material Recovery Facility (MRF), enhancing plastic sorting. These cameras provide material breakdowns, enabling performance monitoring, comprehensive analysis, and targeted improvements.

While a human element remains crucial, advancing technology presents opportunities for ongoing innovation in our processes. Embracing new technologies is essential for the evolving waste market. Moreover, automation significantly reduces the risk to human health in an industry known for its high accident statistics.

OPERATIONAL INNOVATIONS

ELECTRIC VEHICLES

We are prioritising the purchasing of electric vehicles over dieselpowered.

These electric vehicles, like our MRF, are all powered by renewable energy.

Climate change is the single biggest threat facing our planet. Our single biggest source of carbon emissions is through our vehicle fleet. As part of our commitment to becoming net zero by 2030, we are on a journey to fully electrify our fleet of vehicles by 2030.

We have three electric vehicles on the road, making emissions free collections for our clients, and resulting in a reduction of 250 tonnes of CO2e annually.

We also have several smaller electric vans in our fleet for small deliveries and maintenance. We have a further two electric RCVs, an electric cage vehicle and an electric RoRo vehicle arriving in 2024, giving us the largest fleet of electric vehicles from any commercial waste management company in London.





OPERATIONAL INNOVATIONS



E-BIKES

Our e-bike collection scheme was the next step towards net zero by 2030. In partnership with Pedal Me and Zedify, our e-bikes now provide on-street sack collections, deliver commercial waste bags to businesses and monitor littering hot spots across London's SE1 borough.

This scheme produces zero tailpipe emissions and reduces noise pollution in a densely populated urban area.

Our service covers 140 miles per bike per week, offering low-density collections of 30-50 sacks per day, and high-density collections of 50-80 sacks per day.

Trees for Cities aims to create social cohesion and beautify our cities through tree planting, community-led design, education, and training initiatives in urban areas that need it the most.

From our roots of collecting waste paper from businesses through Central London the importance of conserving our trees is not lost on

From the beginning, we've recycled paper into high-quality white office paper, reducing the need for new paper across London and the South Coast. As a result, we save thousands of trees each year.

Trees For Cities have planted over 1,700,000 trees since 1993 and continues to work with communities to create healthier urban environments.














We host CSR volunteering events to prevent waste from entering the River Thames.



The Marine Conservation Society are on the frontlines of the ocean emergency, fighting to 'turn the tide'.

The ocean makes up over 70% of our planetonly 1/3 of it is 'protected'. MCS UK predicts that less than 1% of our oceans are well-managed.

Today, there are over 8.3 million microplastics in the ocean, and counting. 37% of marine mammals are currently threatened with extinction. And most pertinently; global warming is heating our oceans and sea levels are rising. The need to act is urgent.

100% of the plastics Recorra collect on our clients' behalf are treated within the UK- none of it is exported overseas to developing countries or sent to landfill for incineration.

We have donated over £12k to support biodiversity within the UK's waterways.













1 in 3 children in London are unable to read or write at the expected level upon leaving primary school. This means that approximately 1.62 million children in English schools can't access the school curriculum because they aren't reading well enough.

A huge part of sustainability is ensuring people are equipped with everything they need to thrive- including literacy skills.

By using our services, our clients have helped us provide London's most educationally vulnerable children with £15k worth of tutoring sessions by the Children's Literacy Charity.

For every 15 laptops we collect, a child receives a free tutoring lesson.













For decades, Recorra has partnered with ZSL to help conserve endangered wildlife species and restore ecosystems across the world.

ZSL conduct pioneering research into wildlife, conservation, and produce some of the world's leading research in biodiversity science.

WWF have reported a 68% average decline in our wildlife species; conservation is a daily battle for many to protect the animals inhabiting our planet. Members at ZSL work tirelessly to change this.

In 2022, our clients helped us commit a further £18K to ZSL London to support conservation projects for those critically endangered species.









Founded in the wake of the 2008 financial crisis. Plan Zheroes emerged in response to the shocking amounts of food discarded by supermarkets, coinciding with a time when many struggled to afford meals. Their ultimate goal is to eliminate both food poverty and waste.

With their online platform, Plan Zheroes streamlines the process by allowing businesses to directly donate surplus food. Notifications on the platform inform local charities of available food, specifying quantity, location, and collection time on a first-come-first-served basis.

Recorra contributes 25 pence to Plan Zheroes for each food waste collection, directly supporting efforts to provide food to those in need.













FareShare is made up of 18 independent organisations, who work together to redistribute food to nearly 8,500 frontline charities and community groups.

These include schools, homeless shelters, and community cafes. Every week, FareShare provide food for almost a million meals for vulnerable people across the UK.

We work with FareShare across the South Coast to prevent food waste whilst tackling food insecurity and hunger.









In an era defined by unprecedented environmental challenges, the fight against climate change has become humanity's most pressing imperative.

The journey ahead is one guided by people; at Recorra, it is important to us that we look after our own, so that we may better work towards a more sustainable and equitable future.

EMPLOYEE WELLBEING

We recognise that employee welfare and wellbeing are paramount to maintaining a positive workforce. We implement the following policies and health schemes to ensure our employees are well cared for:

EMPLOYEE ASSISTANCE PROGRAMME (EAP)

This programme was designed to help professionals deal with personal or professional problems that might affect their health and general wellbeing. This involves life support, bereavement support, and online CBT. Our mental health first aiders are trained to provide support to employees experiencing mental health issues.

MATERNITY AND PATERNITY LEAVE

Recorra has a clear commitment to positively supporting working parents and providing the opportunity for our staff to integrate their careers with family responsibilities. Recorra employees can take up to a month paternity leave, and 52 weeks' maternity leave.

HEALTH CASH PLAN

This plan covers a variety of personal and family health issues, including but not limited to: dental issues; diagnostic consultations; therapies including physiotherapy; chiropractic treatment; homeopathy and acupuncture; NHS prescription charges and flu vaccines; health screenings; and more. This plan also covers children of employees.

COST OF LIVING AID

We offer our staff daily free breakfast, and lunch vouchers on the last Friday of every month, to help our staff with the current cost of living crisis.

MONTHLY MASSAGES

Our staff can also enjoy a massage once a month, designed to relieve body tension and pain caused by desk work.






























CHARITY VOLUNTEERING OPPORTUNITIES AND SOCIAL ACTIVITIES
















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
